

## LIFE AND WORKS

- Hannah Arendt was born into a
   German-Jewish family in
   Hannover in 1906;
- She attended the
   University of Marburg studying
   philosophy, literature and theology;
- She studied with Heidegger and Jaspers;



•She was arrested for doing research on anti-Semitic propaganda, but managed to escape.

• In 1941 Arendt fled to

America because

France had fallen to

the power and

control of Nazi.


She also became an American citizen;


In New York she published


"The Origins of Totalitarianism";

Her most famous work is

"Eichmann in Jerusalem: A
Report on the Banality of Evil"
(1963).

It was an account of the trial of a SS lieutenant colonel who was responsible for transporting

Jews to **death camps**;



- Arendt was the first woman to become a full professor of
   Politics at Princeton University in 1959;
- She also taught at New School for Social Research;
  - •She died at the age of 69, in 1975, in New York.
