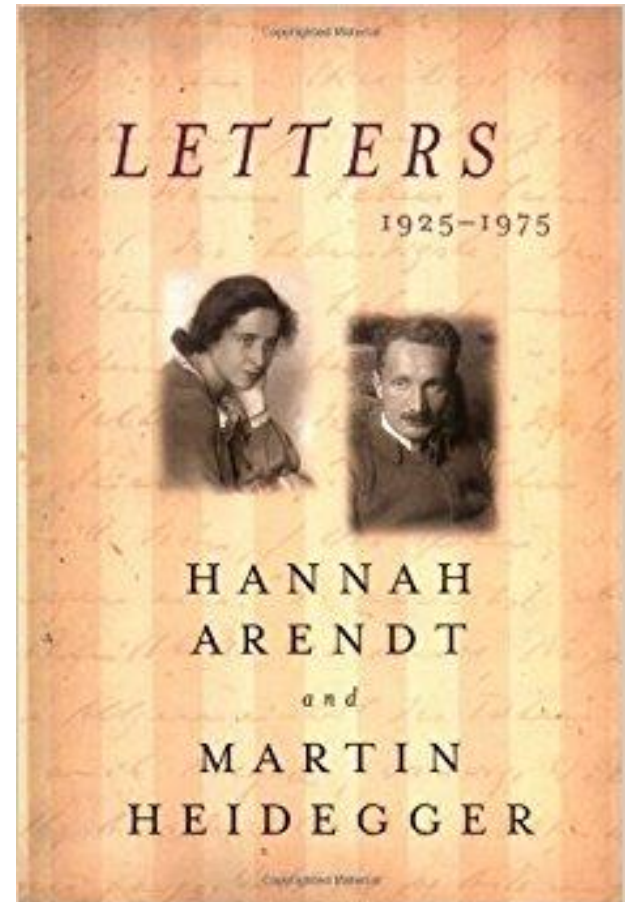

LIFE AND WORKS

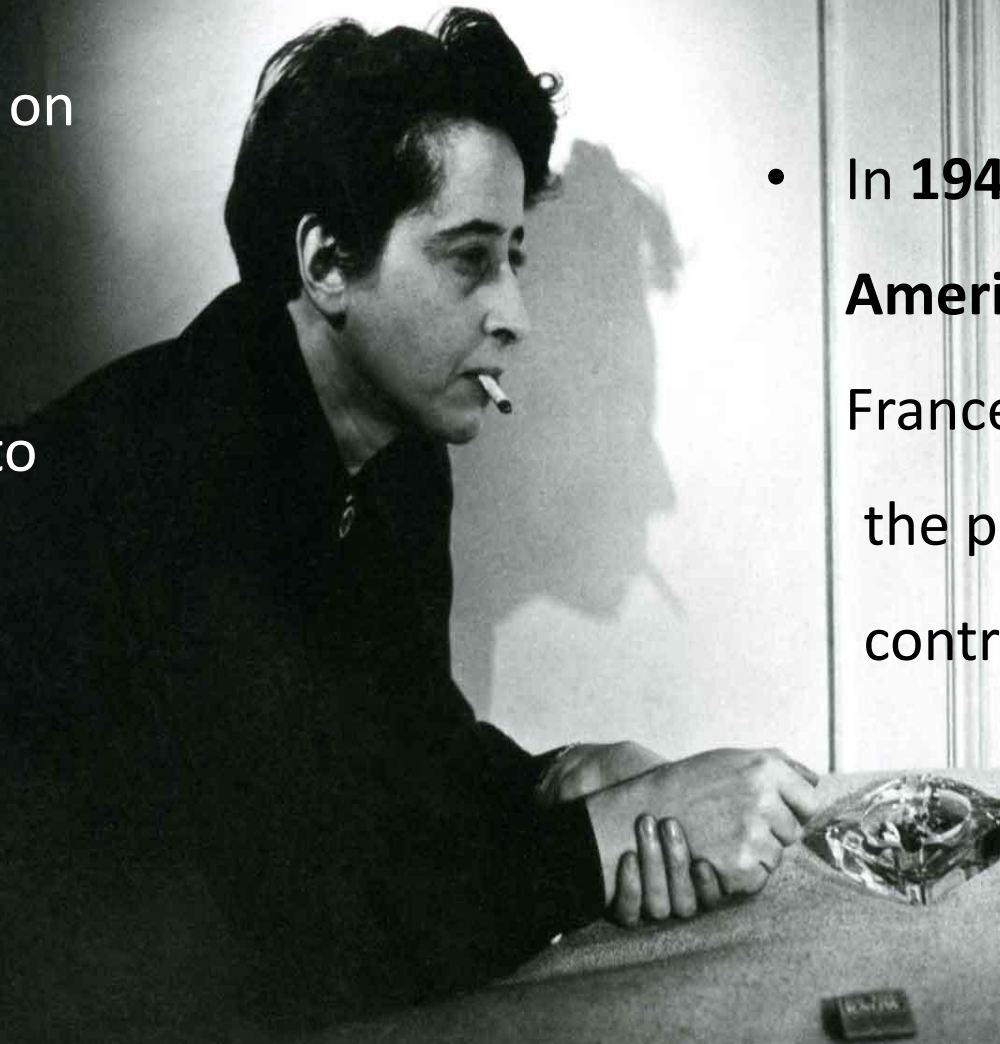
- Hannah Arendt was born into a **German-Jewish family** in **Hannover** in **1906**;
- She attended the **University of Marburg** studying philosophy, literature and theology;
- She studied with **Heidegger** and **Jaspers**;



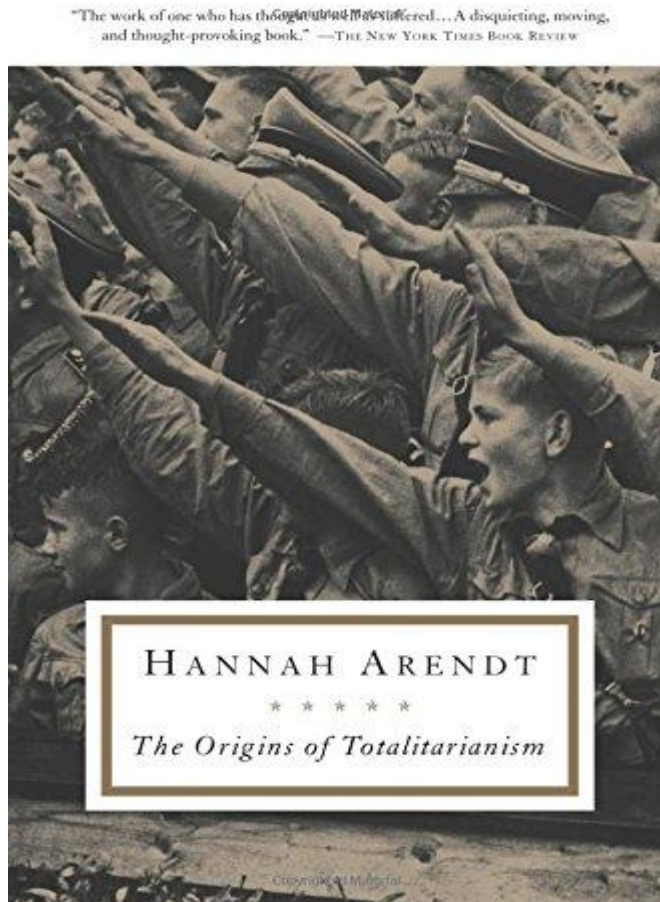
- She was **arrested** for doing research on **anti-Semitic** propaganda, but managed to escape.

- In **1941** Arendt fled to **America** because France had fallen to the power and control of Nazi.

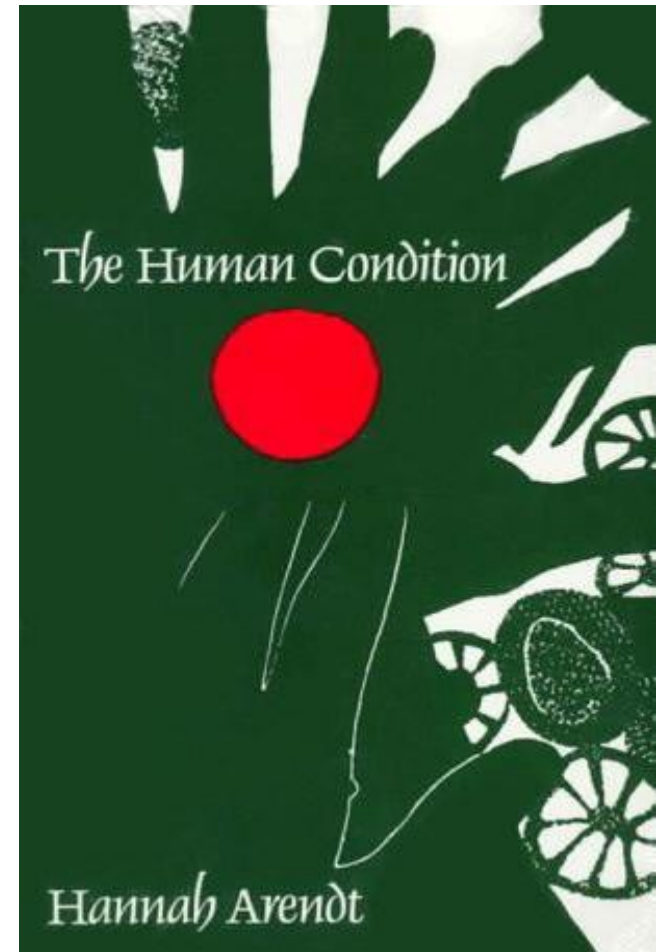
- She also became an **American citizen** ;

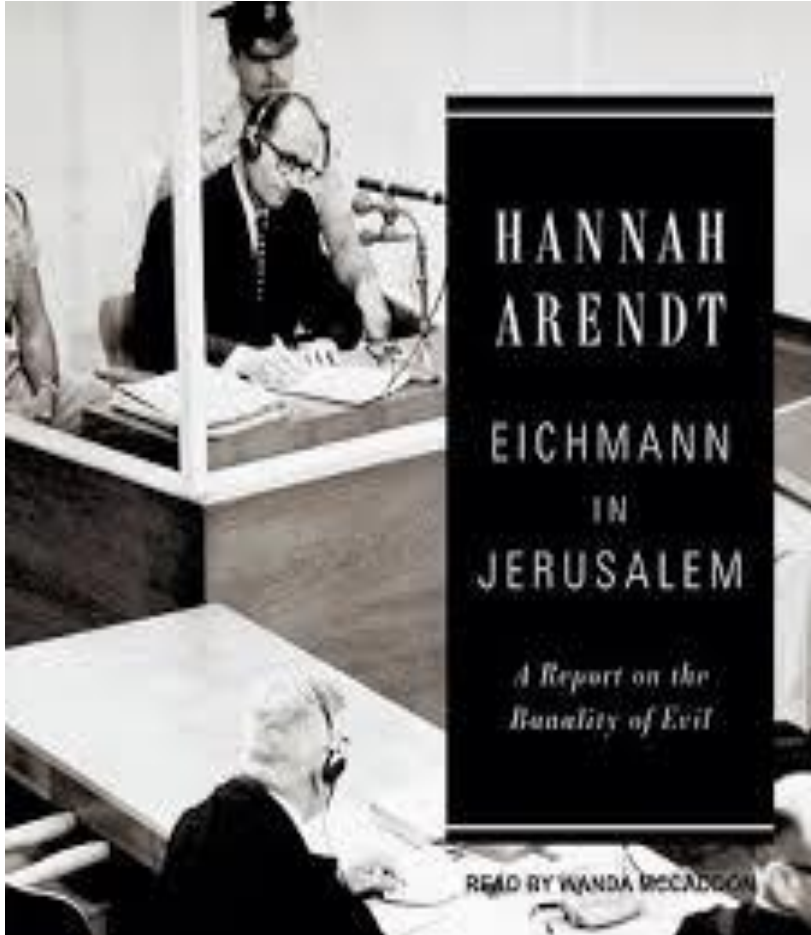


- In New York she published
“The Origins of Totalitarianism”;



- In 1958 she published
“The Human Condition”;





- Her most famous work is “Eichmann in Jerusalem: A Report on the Banality of Evil” (1963).

It was an account of the trial of a SS lieutenant colonel who was responsible for transporting Jews to **death camps**;



- Arendt was the first woman to become a **full professor of Politics** at Princeton University in 1959;
- She also taught at **New School for Social Research**;
- She died at the age of 69, in **1975**, in New York.
